- O1 This project involved adding kerb appeal to an existing building with a makeover, extension and internal update.

  Vast sliding doors provide a seamless connection between the new living room and the back garden.
  - 102 The design of this new house stemmed from a large central living space with high vaulted ceilings and dual-aspect glazed gable ends. A stunning oak frame blends this dream home into its woodland setting.
    - The architecture of this project captures the essence of seaside living, with an artful gallery of light and views. Creating an air of serenity, the sculptural design and complementary materials choices cleverly enhance the living space's magical quality of natural brightness.

his three-storey house, designed by ARCH-Angels Architects, features hints of Bauhaus style to make a significant statement on a street lined with 1930s homes. It is replete with clean lines, extensive glazing and a flat roof that opens up to stunning coastal views.

The proposal involved demolishing the roof of an existing bungalow and adding two new floors above, using lightweight timber construction with high levels of insulation.

The client wanted to maximise views to the south and west, and this has been principally achieved with the cleverly-designed stepped terrace roof. New high-performance, double-glazed windows and doors visually connect the house with the outdoors. These open from the first floor living area to reveal dual-aspect vistas with an elevated outlook over the garden and across the city of Brighton.
